



RATTAN CRAFT KAPUAS, CENTRAL KALIMANTAN



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Kalumpang Village spans **14,149.8 hectares** and is inhabited by 1,053 individuals, comprising 543 males and 510 females. The village's main sources of income include rattan farming, rattan crafting, and labor in palm oil plantations. Portions of the village contain peatlands housing protected ecosystems and agricultural activities. Kalumpang Village boasts a total of **9,970.9 hectares of peatlands, which make up 71% of its total area.**

In Kalumpang Village, there exists a group of **rattan craftsman** called **Hurung Hapakat**, meaning "working together." They weave rattan not only to preserve the Dayak culture but also to safeguard their rattan forests from the expansion of palm oil companies.
